Integrated Resource Process (IRP):

Widely-Used Planning Strategy.

Includes a diversified mix of community representation.

In-Depth study of specific community issues.

Defines how to meet present and future needs.

Key Elements of IRP:

Attendance is requested at all meetings. Listen with an open mind.

Respect opinions and ideas of others. Full attention should be on the speaker.

Meetings are open to the public. Public will be invited to speak at the end.

Agendas will be posted 3 days in advance. Summaries will be posted within a month.

CICWCD Focus:

Provide information to the public and receive community feedback on these important water-related issues.

Present various discussions dealing with water resource issues.

Learn in greater depth what the citizens of Cedar Valley believe about water issues.

Incorporate those thoughts, suggestions, and recommendations into the evolution of future water planning efforts.

Committee Member Focus:

Develop understanding of existing and future water supplies.

Develop an understanding of financial support system for water resource management and delivery.

Review present and future funding options.

Make recommendations for water resource strategy and planning.

Help Cedar Valley meet current and future challenges associated with maintaining a safe and reliable water supply.
